Over the past eight years Indigenous Peoples from over thirty nations have come together in five Indigenous Ayahuasca Conferences...

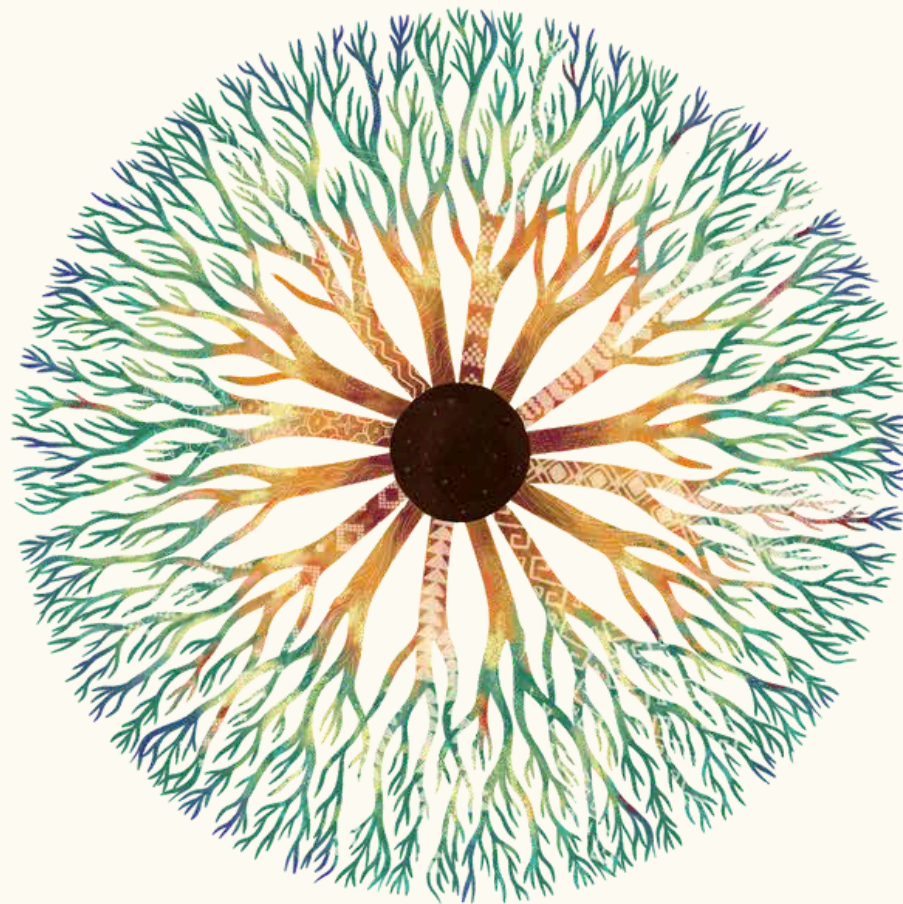

At the closing of the World Ayahuasca Forum we achieved a historic milestone in the global Ayahuasca movement, as a result of a consolidated partnership between the Indigenous Ayahuasca Conference Movement (2017, 2018, 2019, 2022, and 2025) and the World Ayahuasca Conference Movement (2014, 2016, and 2019).

This Forum transformed years of parallel work into unified actions.





The Forum brought together more than 2,000 participants from over 40 countries: policymakers, scientists, philanthropists, journalists, artists, activists, knowledge holders of medicinal plants, conservation organization and other NGO representatives, community leaders, and change-makers from many fields.

A significant delegation of Indigenous spiritual leaders stood at the forefront.

The format, development, and organization of the Forum embody a model of Indigenous and decolonial leadership that inspires the broader field.

This event was a living demonstration of what is possible when Indigenous leadership is respected and intercultural dialogue is conducted consciously.





Through lectures, workshops, panels, round tables, art exhibitions, and extended dialogues—the Forum gave space to shared learning and alliance building.

Navigating differences and challenges, participants found renewed hope in complementing and strengthening one another.

This marked the beginning of building intercultural alliances in service of a common mission:

- **The protection and recognition of ancestral territories, cultures, knowledge systems, and Indigenous sciences**
- **The promotion of safe, respectful, and ethical practices for the diverse uses of ayahuasca worldwide**
- **The fostering of a conscious and regenerative connection with the Sacredness of Life on Earth**





The objectives and guidance of the Indigenous spiritual leaders present at the Forum were embraced by multiple sectors of the international community.

From this Forum, the seeds of a resilient, organized, interculturally grounded global movement, dedicated to healing our relationship with the Earth were sown.

This is not an ending but a beginning.

reciprocity, and reverence for Life.**



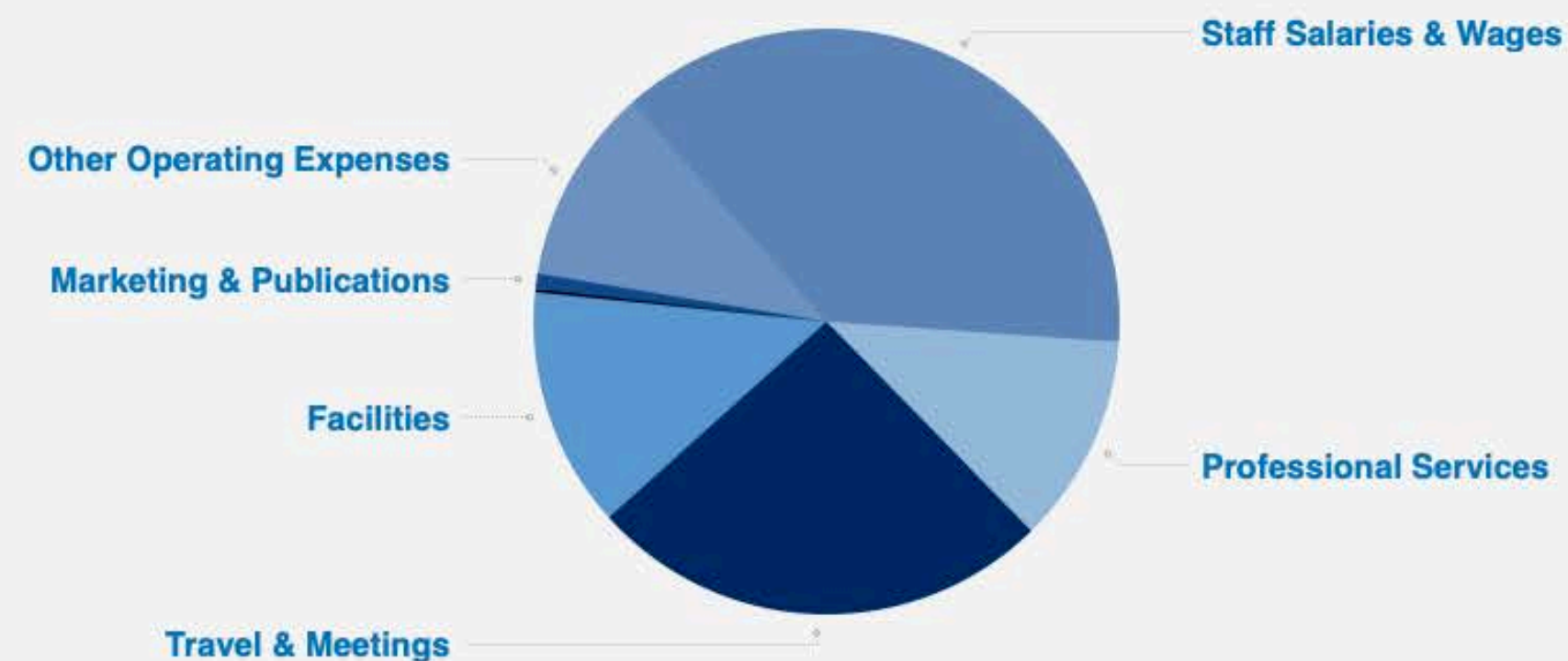

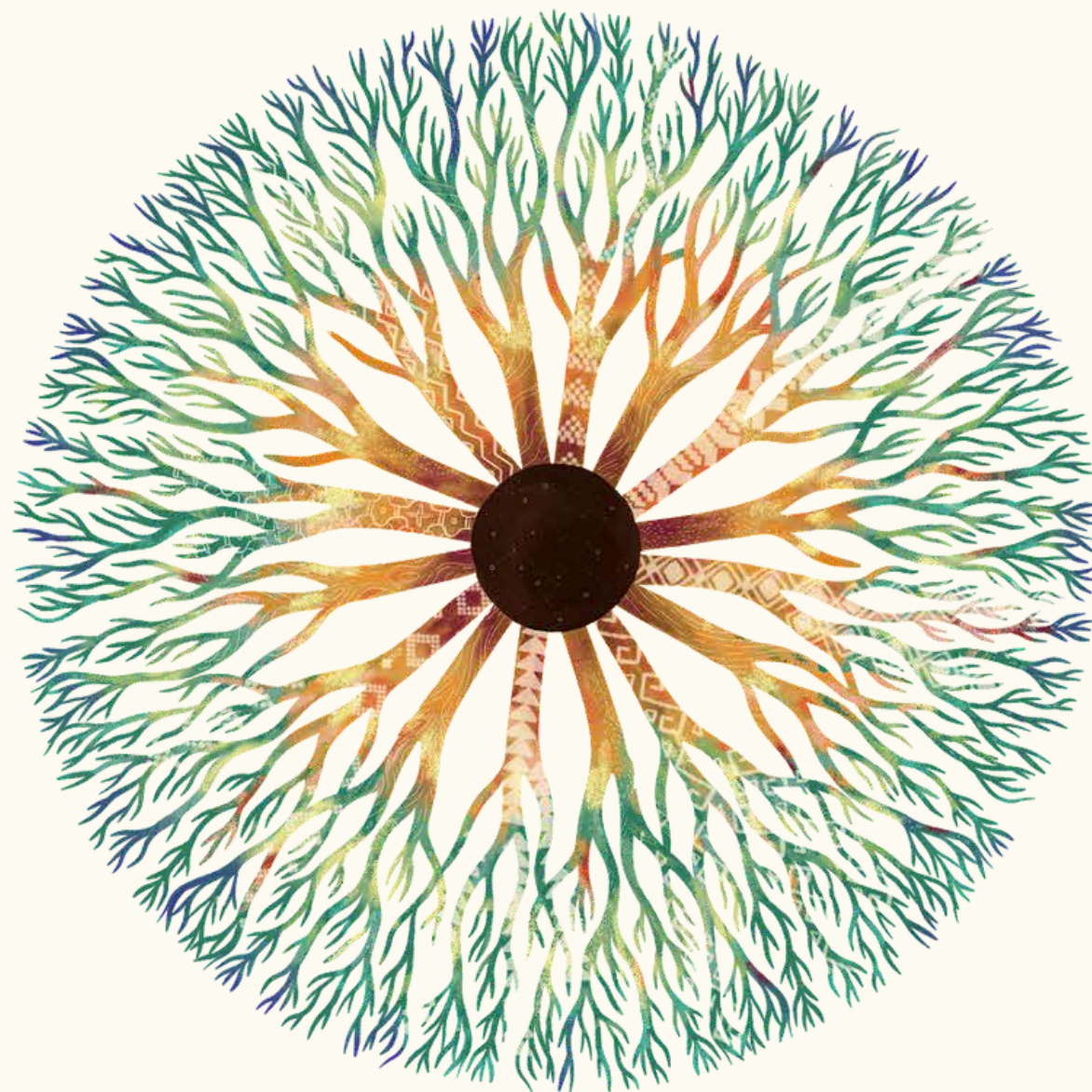


The Forum's total estimated budget is 1,9M USD. Ensuring accessible ticket prices, we expect ticket sales to bring in 900k USD.

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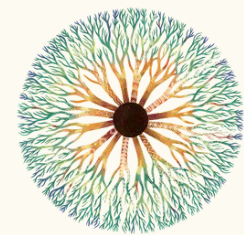
